

Ramon Theater (1)

15 East Wall Street

Built for vaudeville in 1925 by Frank Thompson; designed by M. Leo Elliott, a well-known Tampa architect. Vera Thompson operated the movie theater until the 1960s.

Jimmy's Barber Shop (2)

17 East Wall Street

Built in 1925. First home of Citizen's Bank. Since then, used as a barbershop, first by Jake Wise and then by Junior North.

Thompson Building (3)

19-25 East Wall Street

Built by Frank Thompson in 1916. Over the years, home of Powell's Drug Store and Men's Shop, Scorgie's Hardware and others.

Latt Maxcy Corporation (4)

33 East Wall Street

Built in mid-1930s. Served as Standard Oil Service Station and a Ford Dealership.

Carol L. Hill, P.A.;**Frostproof Business Services (5)**

101 East Wall Street

Built in early 1960s for the law offices of David Higginbottom. Site of 1914-1916 Post Office.

Town n' Country Salon (6)

11 East Wall Street

On this site in 1915, the Gantt Hotel was built. Later known as Park Hotel and then as Lake Reedy Hotel.

115 East Wall Street (7)

Built prior to 1916 for RWA Duncan's real estate and insurance office. Housed first office and printing equipment of Highland News. Friends Sprayer office from 1935-40.

Frostproof Indian Mound (8)

Corner E. Wall & N. Lake Reedy Blvd.

Historic monument marks the Burial Grounds of Ancient Indians, circa 1500s to early 1700s.

Home & Farm Supply (9)

136 East Wall Street

Built circa 1918 for C.M. Mallet. Later became Mallett-Brown, then Empie's. All distributors of fertilizer, cement, and building materials.

Historical Frostproof Depot (10)

118 East Wall Street

First train arrived in Frostproof in January 1912. Depot opened June 1912 by Atlantic Coast Line Railway; remodeled several times.

Spurlow's Outdoor Outfitters (11)

30 East Wall Street

Built in 1950 by S. V. Duke and operated as Frostproof Hardware.

28 East Wall Street (12)

Former home of Wardlaw's Dry Cleaners.

Wardlaw-Dickinson (13)

22 East Wall Street

Built in the late 1920s and among other uses, has been a funeral parlor, restaurant and a dry goods store.

Frostproof Art League & Gallery (14)

12 East Wall Street

Original site of Flood Hotel circa 1912. Current building erected in 1914 as Frostproof State Bank. Later housed Citizens Bank, Post Office, Carol's Dress Shop, Lynn's Dress Shop and Watson's Pharmacy.

Citizens Bank & Trust (15)

2 East Wall Street

Built in 1925. Today's lobby housed Citizens Bank (west) and Cannon's Drug Store (east). Arcade home to many shops and businesses (outside viewing only).

Commemorative Sidewalk Bricks (16)

Sidewalks in center of town.

Frostproof Care Center & McFarlane Furniture (17)

17-29 South Scenic Highway

Built in early 1920s as the 30-room Highlands Hotel, with 8 storefronts. Stores over the years have included Highland Grill, Betts & Payne's, Pike's Jewelers, B & B, Western Auto, Scarborough Furniture and more.

P & J Recreation (Home of famous Slaw-burger) (18)

33 South Scenic Highway

In 1920s, gas station on-site. In 1930s-40s, Wade Wardlaw operated a poolroom and beer joint.

103 South Scenic Highway (19)

Built in 1953 as Payne's Red & White Grocery.

The Orange Grove Restaurant (20)

133 South Scenic Highway

Built in 1952 as the Bullpup Drive-In. Earliest Bullpup was closer to corner and sidewalk. *Elvis ate here!*

Harvey's Food Mart (21)

203 South Scenic Highway

Built in the early 1960s by Eugene Lamb as Scenic Suprex Grocery, using bricks from Methodist Church built on this site in 1915.

Keystone Realty (22)

245 South Scenic Highway

Built circa 1926 as Texaco Station.

Don Hodge Auto Service (23)

305 South Scenic Highway

Canning plant in 1920s, managed by W.W. Owens. Murdock Sullivan's Oldsmobile dealership in 1940s.

Erwine's Marine (24)

250 South Scenic Highway

Built in 1930s, housed Durance service station and convenience store.

Frostproof Historical Museum (25)

210 South Scenic Highway

Built in 1922 as Frostproof Public Library. Open 1-4 Saturdays year-round and Tuesdays / Thursdays from October through April. Closed holidays.

200 South Scenic Highway (26)Built in 1949 as Palm Court, a motel. *Elvis slept here!***Frostproof City Hall (27)**

111 West First Street

Built as Frostproof High School in 1926. *Go Bullpups!***Frostproof Elementary School Annex (28)**

Corner of West First and Magnolia

Site of Red Brick Elementary School built in 1915. Current building erected in 1933 by WPA as Frostproof Elementary School.

127 West Wall Street (29)

Built in 1950 as office of Dr. Kenneth Dunham and Dr. Henry Cordes.

47 West Wall Street (30)

Built in 1925 as City Hall, fire and police departments, city jail with dance hall upstairs.

Frostproof Masonic Lodge #229 (31)

46 West Wall Street

Built in 1948 as a meeting place for Frostproof's Grand Lodge of Free & Accepted Masons.

40 West Wall Street (32)

Built in 1958, former home of Dick Backus Realty and Lamar Stewart Insurance; later Perry Wilson's Dry Cleaners.
